


Overview of Our Panel Discussion

We have gathered some of the most knowledgeable, experienced people in the buffalo industry to attempt to look into the next step that our industry needs to, and will take. In talking to some people that have been in the buffalo business 30-40 years it appears that the buffalo business is has always been cyclical. It also appears that the cycle is prone to extremes. These extreme swings of supply/price hamper the progress of buffalo in the pasture and on the plate.

There are three basic components of all livestock industries here in North America. There is the primary producer-the cow/calf operator. There is the feeder. And there is the packer/marketer. We have tried to gather knowledgeable operators from all three groups. Our goal is to get information from the different, major factors of the industry so that the average producer can make some decisions. We are not trying to set prices, this is all for discussion only.

To set the basis for discussion we have to make some assumptions. We are going to discuss \$2.40 on-the-rail fed buffalo bulls. We are going to assume that corn is at \$4.50 per bushel. We are going to assume that hay is \$70 per ton. We are going to assume that fuel is at \$3.50 per gallon. The biggest assumption will be that rainfall will be "normal". What we are going to try to find out is at what price do calves have to be for herd expansion. How fast will producers expand. At what point will marketers begin to see price resistance and how important is that with a shrinking herd. Will feeders need guarantees from packers with rising calf prices. It should be a lively discussion. One we hope will benefit the industry.



Mark Kossler To Address Group

Mark Kossler, manager of Ted Turner's Vermejo Ranch in Raton, New Mexico, will be our featured speaker on Saturday afternoon. Mark will be presenting information on managing your animals.

Mark has been involved in a number of feed trials through the Turner Ranches and the data and information he will present is something that will be useful for anyone in the industry, whether you feed out your animals or just sell your calves. The data compares costs in various settings as well as insight into how social structure can affect the various aspects of herd management.

We are very fortunate to have someone with Mark's knowledge and experience here to share his information and insight with our group. You won't want to miss his presentation!

2008 Winter Conference Lineup

The 2008 Dakota Territory Buffalo Association Winter Conference and Black Hills Buffalo Classic Show and Sale will begin on Friday, February 1 and end with the live animal auction on Sunday, February 3. The conference will take place at the Best Western Ramkota Hotel and Convention Center located just off I-90 in Rapid City, South Dakota.

The weekend's activities begin on Friday afternoon with the Ladies Spa Day, as well as various meetings. Friday evening, everyone is invited to attend the social at Prairie Edge Trading Co. and Galleries in downtown Rapid City. The Prairie Edge store is open for shopping during the social and the atmosphere of the entire evening has made this a very popular event. The welcoming reception begins at 5:00 p.m. and ends at 7:00 p.m.

On Saturday, the conference gets underway with a general membership meeting. The balance of the morning will be devoted to a panel discussion about the future of the industry. The panel will feature leaders in processing, cow/calf production and feeding operations discussion their viewpoints on the future of the industry as it relates to their specific area of interest.

Over the lunch hour, South Dakota State Veterinarian, Dr. Sam Holland, will lead the group through updates on health and disease issues facing the buffalo industry.

The afternoon session will feature speaker Mark Kossler, general manager of Ted Turner's Vermejo Ranch in Raton, New Mexico. Kossler will speak to the group about management practices for buffalo and also give some insight into various feed trials he has conducted on the Turner ranches.

The 12th annual Black Hills Buffalo Classic (BHBC) Show and Sale will feature 12 consignors who have entered more than 90 head of buffalo and consignments are still being accepted at this time. The animals will be judged and sold at auction at the Pennington County Events Center, located at the Central States Fairgrounds in Rapid City. There have been changes to the class lineup for the show and it will now feature two new classes, the Top Ten Heifer Calf class and the Top Five Bull Calf class. Buyers will have the opportunity to select larger groups of animals from the same ranch to use as replacement animals in their breeding herds. Single animals will be offered in the heifer calves, bull calves, yearling heifers, yearling bulls and two year old bred heifers.

When the judging is finished, the award winners will be announced during the Saturday evening banquet. Winners of the Reality Based Carcass Class will also be announced during the banquet. Following the awards, the evening will round out with Bison Bingo and the Fun Auction.

On Sunday, the morning gets underway with judge's comments and animal viewing at the pens, located immediately south of the Pennington County Events Center. The Black Hills Buffalo Classic Sale begins at 10:00 a.m.
