## Important Entry Information!

Inside of this newsletter are entries for the DTBA Consignment Auctions (November 17 and December 1 only), the Black Hills Buffalo Classic and the new Carcass Class. All of these items are on separate sheets. Please read through the health regulations for each item and any other contest rules that might apply. When you fill out an entry form, please check the top of the page for the address to send the entry. All of the entry forms will be mailed to different addresses, so please read them carefully and make sure you are returning the correct form to the correct address. Any entries received at the wrong address will be forwarded, but due to time constraints, it will probably affect your entry chances as it will be received late.

All of the above entries will be accepted by mail in only. No phone calls, no faxes and no personal deliveries will be accepted on any of the entries. Understand that the entries are accepted based on the date of postmark, not on when they are received. Please read each entry form carefully as some of the postmark dates are different. Be sure to include entry fees for each entry and make sure any checks or money orders are made out to Dakota Territory Buffalo Association.

## DTBA To Rent Portable Chute

The DTBA has recently arranged to purchase a portable chute system that will be available for rent to DTBA members to help them work animals. The association is doing this as a service to our members as well as to help with our upcoming consignment auctions.

The chute system is being manufactured by Berlinic Manufacturing of Quill Lake, Saskatchewan, Canada. The chute will come equipped with wheels, the scale and a power pac. Members renting the chute will need to ensure that they have an alley or ready chute that will lead to the working chute.

The DTBA Board of Directors has authorized the renting of the chute system by current DTBA members at the rate of \$125 per 24 hour period that the chute is checked out to a producer. Additionally, there will be a \$500 deposit required and a rental agreement form will need to be signed prior to checking out the chute.

The portable chute system will not be available for approximately five days (three days prior and two following) each of the DTBA consignment auctions. The auctions are scheduled for November 17, December 1, March 16 and April 20. There are also several private consignment auctions being held at the Seven Down Arena and the chute will be needed for those sales as well.

At this time, it is planned to have the chute system located in or near Rapid City, SD.

# Research Committee Makes Proposals

The DTBA Research Committee met in July to discuss research needs which could provide the greatest benefit to producers. Discussion focused on the opportunity for involvement of DTBA members in providing input and direction for future research projects. This effort is in response to the proposed creation of the Bison Integrated Research Consortium which could be formed to coordinate research efforts between South Dakota State University, North Dakota State University and Tribal Colleges. Senators Daschle and Conrad are requesting a two million dollar appropriation to aid in forming the consortium.

Committee members agreed that a weakness in research involving other livestock species is that controlled conditions under which research is conducted in a university setting are seldom duplicated in real management situations. The Research Committee proposes several on-the-ranch projects in addition to traditional research methods.

Suggestions for those on-the-ranch projects include: methods

of growing out replacement heifers; handling methods and stress management; handling facilities and stress management; feed trials involving a wide range of methods, including grass and grain; Pinkeye and fly control; internal parasite control; meat grading criteria; mineral requirements; water quality and water developments as they pertain to bison "pecking order".

The committee felt that the industry as a whole might benefit from marketing research projects at the University level to identify our customer base and find out exactly what they want. Seedstock producers need to identify who will be the next producers. We need to support flexibility within the industry so that people have a number of available options to meet the needs of those customers they decide to serve.

# 2001 Black Hills Buffalo Classic Terms & Conditions

#### **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. Negative Tuberculosis test (caudal fold) on all animals. Test must have been done within 25 days of sale date.
- 2. Negative Brucellosis test on all animals. Test must have been done within 25 days of sale date.
- 3. Negative Anaplasmosis test on all animals. Test must have been done within 25 days of sale date.
- 4. Negative Blue Tongue test on all animals. Test must have been done within 25 days of sale date.
- 5. All females MUST be calfhood vaccinated for Brucellosis. Show tag numbers, metal tag numbers and BV tattoo numbers must correctly coincide on the Health Certificate.
- 6. All animals must be treated with INJECTABLE ivermec. IMPORTANT: Animals coming from south of the southern Wyoming-Nebraska-Iowa borders must be injected within 10 days of the show date. Animals coming from north of these southern borders must be injected within 25 days of the show date.
- 7. ALL yearling and two year old bulls MUST be semen checked and certified fertile. IMPORTANT!: Yearling buffalo bulls mature later than beef bulls and are often harder to test. In comparison, a two year old buffalo bull is like testing a one year old beef bull. Make sure your veterinarian knows this!
- 8. All two year old heifers must be certified at least 90 days pregnant.
- 9. All yearling heifers must be certified OPEN. IMPORTANT: Our feeling is that the buyers are paying a lot of money for these buffalo and we want these females to fit into their program.
- 10. Three copies must be furnished with the original health certificate. Separate health certificates are required for each animal. Pens of three can be on one certificate with three copies.
- 11. Animals WILL NOT be unloaded if the health certificates do not meet ALL of the above requirements. NO EXCEPTIONS! Pregnancy test, semen test, ivermec and mouthing must be written across the bottom of each health certificate with the date and signature of your veterinarian. Keep your test paperwork with you in case it may be needed.

#### HORNS

Dehorned animals accepted are yearling and two year old heifers ONLY. All others must have either two good horns or broken horns which have fully healed. We will work with you in case of a broken horn while at the show. Severe bleeders cannot enter the sale ring.

#### EAR TAGS

Show tags, metal vaccine/tag and registration button are the only tags accepted to be in the buffalo's ear. Consignors will be responsible for applying the show tags in the LEFT ear. This must be done before the animals will be allowed to unload. Any animal that shows up with an extra tag will be charged \$50 to take the tag out.

#### **ENTRY LIMITS AND DEADLINES**

Twenty (20) head for all classes except two year old bulls. Twelve (12) two year old bulls will be allowed. One (1) head per consignor per class until November 15. If a class is not filled by this date, you will be allowed a two (2) head per consignor per class until December 1. Waiting list will apply based on the earliest postal dates on entries. Limits per consignor will be enforced. Limits per class are flexible depending upon overall entries.

#### CLASSIC PRODUCER AWARD

(Determined on a point system)

Points for Gold, Silver and Bronze awards will be given on a 3-2-1 basis. A Grand Champion will earn one extra bonus point. A Reserve Champion will earn one-half point. In the case of a tie, the producer winning trophies in the most classes will prevail. Example: two silvers and one bronze will beat one gold and one silver, etc. If still tied, a Grand and then Reserve award will prevail. In the case of two consignments, only one can be awarded points for the Classic Producer's Award.

#### LIABILITY

- 1. The consignor assumes all responsibilities in regards to, but not limited to, the above terms and conditions of this show and sale. The DTBA acts only as agents and will assume NO responsibility in the event of injury or death to any animal or for any discrepancy between the buyers and the consignors.
- 2. The Judges and/or Show Committee reserve the right to disqualify and remove any animal(s) from the Show and Sale if the animal(s) appear to be of undesirable quality or of the wrong age. A chute will also be on hand. The Committee's decisions will be final.

**NOTE:** The sifting committee will have no tolerance for animals that are undesirable. Any undesirable animals will be loaded back on to the consignor's trailer. It will be the responsibility of the consignor to provide feed and care for his/her animal(s).

# Consignment Auction Health Requirements

- 1. Negative Tuberculosis test (caudal fold) on all animals. Test must have been done within 25 days of sale date.
- 2. Negative Brucellosis test on all animals. Test must have been done within 25 days of sale date.
- 3. Negative Anaplasmosis test on all animals. Test must have been done within 25 days of sale date.
- 4. Negative Blue Tongue test on all animals. Test must have been done within 25 days of sale date.
- 5. All females must be calfhood vaccinated for Brucellosis. Show tag numbers, metal tag numbers and BV tattoo numbers must correctly coincide on the Health Certificate.
- 6. All animals must be treated with INJECTABLE ivermec. IMPORTANT: Animals coming from south of the southern Wyoming-Nebraska-Iowa borders must be injected within 10 days of the sale date. Animals coming from north of these southern borders must be injected within 25 days of the sale date.
- 7. ALL yearling and two year old bulls MUST be semen checked and certified fertile.
- 8. All two year old heifers must be certified in season pregnant.
- 9. Three copies must be furnished with the original health certificate. Separate health certificates are required for each animal. Belle Fourche Veterinary Clinic reserves the right to refuse animals.
- 10. Animals WILL NOT be unloaded if the health certificates do not meet ALL of the above requirements. NO EXCEPTIONS! Pregnancy test, semen test, ivermec and mouthing must be written across the bottom of each health certificate with the date and signature of your veterinarian. Keep your test paperwork with you in case it may be needed.
- 11. Sale tags, metal vaccine/tag and registration button are the only tags accepted to be in the buffalo's ear. Consignors will be responsible for applying the sale tags in the LEFT ear. This must be done before the animals will be allowed to unload. Any animal that shows up with an extra tag will be charged \$50 to remove the tag. Registered NBA buttons are allowed. Tags will be mailed out to all consignors. A \$5 per tag fee will be charged for unused tags.
- 12. Animals that are older than two years old will not be allowed. Two year old breeding bulls or two year old bred heifers will be accepted. Older animals will not be allowed to unload at the facility.
- 13. Arrival of animals will begin at 12 noon on Thursday, the day before the sale.
- 14. Animals need to be loaded out by 12 noon on Saturday, the day after the sale.
- 15. A five percent commission on all animals will be charged on the selling price. Owners of no sale animals will be charged five percent of the last bid. You must be a current Dakota Territory Buffalo Association member in good standing to sell animals at these sales.
- 16. Tags will be mailed out to all consignors after the Dakota Territory Buffalo Association receives a \$10 per head consignment fee. This fee will be subtracted from the commission when the animal sells.
- 17. Consignments will be taken on a first come, first serve basis by post date of entry. If one sale fills up, left over animals will have the first option for the next sale date.

# DTBA Members Serve Up Bison Meat At Buffalo Chip

The Dakota Territory Buffalo Association (DTBA) had the opportunity to serve bison meat to many hungry bikers during the annual Sturgis Motorcycle Rally held in mid-August in Sturgis, SD. The association was invited out to a local campground, ironically the Buffalo Chip Campground, to serve bison meat to participants in the Peter Fonda Freedom Ride, a fundraising bike tour through the Black Hills. When the biker's finished the ride, they ended up at the Buffalo Chip Campground just east of Sturgis. There the food and a special treat awaited them.

As the association members met up outside the campground, there was a special guest among the group. Jet, a two

year old bison heifer, was the real star of

the show. She was there courtesy of Jim and Leslie Strand, managers of Johnson Bison Ranch, Shadehill, SD. Jet was raised as a bottle calf and she's halter broke. Her calm, quiet demeanor was put to the ultimate test during her visit to the campground.

Upon arriving at the campground, the guys set about putting up a small, portable corral for Jet while Jim quietly unloaded her and walked her around. Immediately, the attention began. Jet was an instant celebrity. As camera crews put their camera lens

watched them. People were coming up to have their picture taken with her and there was much fuss.

When the bikers arrived, they opened up the gates to let them park...only there was no room to park. Not even a motorcycle. We formed a line around Jet, trying to keep the bikers from parking on top of her. They rolled in and kept on rolling in...right next to the trailer and pen, right next to the serving table, right next to Jet. Jim calmly led Jet through a maze of pop cases and boxes over to a quiet spot BEHIND the serving table. There was no hope of getting her anywhere near the pen so we all crossed our fingers and silently hoped she wouldn't explode!

We needn't have worried. Jet handled all the noise, the attention, the pictures, the strangers, the gawkers...you name it, she took it in stride. We were more nervous than she was. There's no telling

how many hundreds of people had their picture taken with Jet, but there were plenty. It's a guarantee that she's gracing more than a few one-hour photo machines and is the subject of much story telling.

The dinner went very well. The bikers lined up to start eating, all the while staring at the beast behind the table. One or two people made the comment that they couldn't eat bison meat with the real thing standing there, but those comments were few and far between and mostly joking. What we did hear a lot of was how good the meat was and where to get more. People were also interested in the nutritional aspects of the meat. There were plenty of DTBA members on hand to answer questions and offer information on meat purchases and bison in general.

There were a number of celebrities on hand at the campground, including, of course, Peter Fonda. Among the ride participants, there were some retired football players, including Robb Nelson, Jim Jensen and Jodi Johnson. Robb was very fond

of the bison meat and kept coming back for more, eventually landing his own pot of meat to eat. And eat he did! Along with the athletes, there were some actors in the group, including Branscombe Richmond and Mickey Jones.

After the dinner was served and cleaned up, it became obvious that Jet would be staying at the Buffalo Chip for the evening. Her trailer was surrounded by bikes, the owners of which had wandered off to listen to the concert or watch Robby Knevil do his jump across the stage. Not to worry, Jet spent the remainder of the evening wandering around the campground, attracting much attention and having her picture

taken many more times. Later in the evening, they got the nod from the campground owner to lead Jet onto the stage, but the band wasn't too thrilled about her being in amongst their equipment, so Jet's stage debut will have to wait for another day.

All in all, despite the problems, it was an excellent opportunity to get bison meat out to a whole new group of consumers. Promoting the product and educating the public is everyone's mission in the bison industry. Thanks to Jet, it's sure to have made quite an impression on that group of bikers that she dined with. I doubt any of them will forget about bison for a long time. They all have pictures of the real thing to remind them!

One thing DTBA members did stress to those who were interested in Jet was that she is very unique and a rare animal among her

peers. We all made a big point of telling people that on the average, bison are not gentle, are not halter-broke and are dangerous. While Jet was a wonderful attention-getter and mascot, we certainly did not want people to go away with the attitude that all bison are like her. She is a standout in the bison world and we were fortunate to have her with us.


