Anderson Pioneer Award Recipient

In the buffalo business, it's all about relationships. They are forged in business and friendship, through good times and bad. Your word and a handshake are the foundation of the relationships, the people are the heart and soul.

For so many of us, this industry has provided us with lifelong friends, an extended family if you will. This past February, Dakota Territory Buffalo Association was proud to honor one of our own. A business partner, a friend and more importantly, a

member of this buffalo family we all cherish.

Back in 1950, a small meat plant was built more than a mile outside of Rapid City, South Dakota and became known as Ken's Western Meats. In April of 1979, Ken's Western Meat was purchased at complete auction by Wayne Anderson. Wayne's son, Bruce, was enlisted to help run the plant as a way to enhance the family's feedlot operation. Bruce's partner at the time was Rollie Hartman.

In May of 1979, a young man came along and met Bruce in a meeting that was destined to forge one of those lasting partnerships. Jud Seaman stopped by the plant, met Bruce and landed himself a job that would last until July of 1999. Jud eventually bought out Rollie and became Bruce's partner in RC Western Meats.

The plant dealt mostly in beef, pork and game. They began processing some buffalo back in 1979, with Wall Drug being their biggest customer. In the late 80s, RC Western Meats found itself short of buffalo meat to supply their customers. In an effort to find more buffalo to supply the plant's needs, Jud attended the Gold Trophy Show and Sale one year and purchased every two-year-old bull and one or two yearling bulls.

That was the turning point for the little meat plant on the edge of Rapid City. They began attending buffalo functions and building those relationships. In July of 1999, Jud left the plant and Bruce became the sole owner of RC Western Meats. Al Holzer stepped in and took up the role of plant manager. Office manager, Gail Hise, was and still is another key person in the plant's operations. Bruce then hired Ken Eisenhauer as the first salesman and with the addition of Jeff Storm to the sales team, the

plant was positioned for future growth.

Changing the name to Western Buffalo Company, Bruce took the final step in his commitment to the buffalo industry, dedicating the plant and staff to the full time business of processing buffalo. During the late 1990s, they began to see a glut of buffalo, which was immediately followed by the industry plummet of 2000 and 2001. Western Buffalo Company became a lifeline to so many producers, keeping them afloat by purchasing their animals and sending them out the door with a check in hand to keep them going.

Notes From The President - Wendy Hutchinson


It's been an exciting year for DTBA! We were very excited to host the NBA Summer Conference in Deadwood this past June. It was very successful and well attended. A big thank you



"Bruce committed himself and the plant to buffalo at a critical time while the industry was in a downturn," says Scott Peterson, a good friend of Bruce and customer at Western Buffalo Company. "His actions had a major impact on the industry, especially in our region."

Peterson also noted those personal relationships that have served Western Buffalo Company so well. "Bruce runs his business based on relationships he has developed with the industry and the people in the industry. That has allowed him to become one of the major players in our industry today."

Bruce's level of involvement does not stop at the doors of the meat plant. He has taken a personal interest in the industry and immersed himself in opportunities to help promote and further the buffalo. this ever-changing landscape of buffalo production.









Young Guns and Girlz Gone Wild Updates and Information

The Dakota Territory Buffalo Association (DTBA) is already making plans for the 17th Annual Winter Conference and Black Hills Buffalo Classic Show and Sale, slated for February 7 - 9, 2014 in Rapid City, SD. The conference will take place at the Ramkota Hotel and Conference Center, while the show and sale events will be held at the Central States Fairgrounds with the sale set for Sunday, February 9.

The association is home to the Young Guns Yearling Bull Challenge and the Girlz Gone Wild Two Year Old Bred Heifer Challenge. Both of these performance classes are well underway already, with 68 head of bulls in the Young Guns class and 15 head of heifers in the Girlz Gone Wild class. The Young Guns class will be trimmed down to the top 20-30 head that will make the cut for the show and sale, thus making those bulls the best of the best!

The Young Guns bulls were brought in from their grass test on August 6 with an average weight of 793 pounds on 68 head. 38 of the bulls were in the 800 pound range, with one coming in at 900 pounds and several just right under that threshold. The host ranch,

The Girlz Gone Wild heifers were put out to grass on June 9 and averaged 821 pounds on 15 head. The host ranch, Cammack Buffalo Ranch, has put their best two home-grown bulls on these heifers and they are excited about the class and how well the heifers are looking this fall.

We will be posting more information about these two classes, as well as our carcass class, additional show and sale offerings and the Winter Conference, on our website and Facebook pages. Entry information for the 2014 show and sale will be available early this fall.


